

#### 4. For how many modules may I register?

Please read the whole document!

In terms of *rule 1.2.13 of the Faculty Rules*, a student may register for a maximum of two modules, additional to those modules which is required by the curriculum applicable to the year level for which he registers in 2020. This amounts to a maximum of two modules per semester, or two year modules, or one semester module and one year module. If you register online, you will therefore be allowed to register for your 2nd, 3rd or 4th year (as the case may be), plus 2 modules carried over from the previous year as described above.

Die **maximum amount** of modules for which students may register per programme and per year level, appears below, and no student will be allowed to register for more modules. In order to determine on what year level you are, you may apply the following rule of thumb: you progress to the next level if you passed 50% or more of the previous year. If not, you stay on the level you were on last year, and register according to that curriculum.

**Please note!!** The NWU online registration system does not take into account the provisions contained in *rules 1.2.12 (d) and 1.2.14 (d)* in the Faculty calendar. In terms of these rules, a student must first register for the modules he has to repeat from the previous year. Students who are repeating 3 or more modules may find that web registration is not in accordance with these rules. You will, for instance, be allowed to register for your complete 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> year, and only 2 additional modules which you failed last year. You will not be allowed to register for other modules from last year that should be repeated.

Students who fall in this category need to rectify this erroneous registration as indicated below.

#### **Modules carried over and online registration**

If you only carry 1 or 2 modules over from last year, you should not have a problem to register online, since you will be allowed to register for all the modules which you failed last year, as well as all the modules prescribed for this year. In other words, you will be allowed to register for your 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> year (as the case may be), plus the 2 modules carried over.

#### **Important!**

If you are repeating 3 or more modules from last year, you will be allowed to register online for all prescribed modules of your current historic year (2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> year, as the case may be), and only two repeating modules. You will not be allowed to register for more than 2 repeating modules. Therefore, you should change your online registration if you are repeating 3 or more modules. This can be done on the DIY system (*add and drop*) by adding those modules from last year which you failed, and which you were not allowed to register online. At the same time, you should cancel/drop those modules from your current (historic) academic year which you registered online, but which you are not allowed to register in terms of the above rules (that is, modules in excess of the maximum modules described above with reference to rule 1.2.14). Kindly explain in your application for how many and for which modules you registered when you complete your request on the DIY. If you are in doubt, please see a faculty advisor.

Students must ensure that they do not exceed the amount of modules as indicated! Ultimately you should be registered only for the maximum amount of modules as explained above (2+3+3=8 for e.g.). You cancel those modules which is in excess of the maximum.

#### **Timetables**

Please note that the implication of rules 1.2.12 (d) and 1.2.14 (d) is that, should there be **a clash on the class and examination timetables** between a module to be repeated, and a module that should be registered for this year, only the module which will be repeated may be registered for. Kindly refer to the timetables on the web.
