

## 1. General

It is a student's responsibility to see to it that he registers correctly. An incorrect registration can cause financial difficulties, or may result in a lengthening of your study period, amongst other things.

You must, therefore, ensure that you know exactly what your curriculum looks like, what new modules have been introduced, what modules you have already passed, and what modules you need to register for in 2020.

The Faculty will ensure that all relevant information is made available to students by posting it on e-Fundi under resources. The most important pieces of information are:

- The NWU Academic Rules and the Faculty's yearbook (on the NWU webpage under the heading *Study at NWU* on the landing page);
- Curriculum control forms for the different programmes (on e-Fundi). Ensure that you use the correct form - the qualification and programme codes for the curriculum that you are registered for appear on your academic record;
- Academic record (available on the DIY portal);
- Registration documents (only for those students who need to register over the counter). Available at the Faculty.
- Transitional rules for pipeline students (applicable to students who need to register for some 3<sup>rd</sup> year modules due to the fact that the new curriculums are being phased in on 3<sup>rd</sup> year level).
- The timetables for 2020. That is, the class and examination timetables for the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, which is available on the NWU website. Students are not allowed to register for modules which clash on the timetables.
- All documents posted on e-Fundi which contains relevant information regarding registration. These are:
