## 12. Registration at other tertiary institutions (UNISA)

Should you wish to take a module through another tertiary institution (such as UNISA), you have to obtain permission from the faculty to do so. Complete the electronic form for simultaneous registration at more than one institution. Your attention is drawn to the fact that you must apply and register at such other institution, and you should familiarise yourself with the closing dates for applications and registrations. Please determine whether the institution will allow you to register for non-degree purposes.

Please also bear in mind that not all the NWU modules offered have an equivalent at such other institution. Furthermore, it may happen that there may be clashes between UNISA modules and NWU modules pertaining to examination dates. Unfortunately, in such instances we will not be able to help you.

Students will only be allowed to register at another tertiary institution under the following circumstances:

- 1) they failed the module they now want to register for at the other institution (such as UNISA);
- 2) there is a timetable clash because of this failed module(s).

If a student does qualify to register for a module at another institution in terms of the abovementioned exceptions, the following restrictions are applicable:

- Students that register for LLB can complete a maximum of 4 modules at another institution during the 4 years of their study, of which a maximum of 2 modules may be registered in their final year.
- BA in Law and B Com in Law students can complete a maximum of 2 modules at another institution, and this can only be done during their final year.
