Head west on Joe Slovo Rd toward Service Rd Make a U-turn at Hendrik Potgieter Rd Take the 1st left onto Bishop Desmond Tutu St Turn right onto N12 Turn left onto Govan Mbeki Dr Turn left onto Totius St

Johannesburg

- 1. Head east on Market St toward Delvers St
- 2. Turn left onto Van Beek St
- 3. Take the 2nd left onto Error St
- 4. Turn left onto Sivewright Ave/M31, Continue to follow M31
- 5. Merge onto Francois Oberholzer Fwy/M2 via the ramp on the right to Roodepoort
- 6. Take exit 9 to merge onto M1 toward Bloemfontein
- 7. Take exit 391 to merge onto N12 toward M68/Soweto/Kimberley/N1/Bloemfontein





- 8. Take exit 67 for M68 toward Soweto
- Keep right at the fork, follow signs for N12/Bloemfontein/Kimbereley and merge onto N1/N12
- 10.Slight left onto N12
- 11. Turn right onto James Moroka St/R53

- 1. Head west on North St toward Kieser St
- 2. Continue onto Rose St
- 3. Turn left onto Parker St
- 4. Turn right onto Soutpansberg Rd/M22
- 5. Turn left onto Hamilton St
- 6. Turn right onto Johannes Ramokhoase St
- 7. Turn left onto Schubart St/R101, Continue to follow R101
- 8. Slight right onto Ben Schoeman Fwy/N14 (signs for N1/Johannesburg/Krugersdorp), Continue to follow Ben Schoeman Fwy
- 9. Continue onto N1
- 10. Continue onto M1
- 11. Take exit 391 to merge onto N12 toward M68/Soweto/Kimberley/N1/Bloemfontein
- 12. Take exit 67 for M68 toward Soweto
- 13.Keep right at the fork, follow signs for N12/Bloemfontein/Kimbereley and merge onto N1/N12
