Intentions

- The intention of By-laws –is to *inter alia* fulfill the objects of Local government in terms of s 152 of the Constitution by ensuring accountable government, provision of services in a sustainable manner, promote a safe and healthy environment, encourage the involvement of communities in matters of government

- The intention of Law Enforcement is to ensure that by-laws are implemented through enforcement.



The 4 E's Principle

- Environment
 - Is the environment conducive to the intention and purpose of the by-law ("fishing spot")
- Engineering
 - Engineer / build / change the environment to suite the desired outcome of the by-law
- Education
 - Educate the community and effected parties as to what is expected of them to achieve the desired outcome (PPP, workshops etc.)
- Enforcement
 - Law Enforcement to ensure that the intention of the By-law is achieved and maintained

- Public Protest due to poor service delivery
- Corruption/ Unethical conduct
- Poor public Participation/ Consultation during adoption of By-law process
- Courts over burdened
- Failure to embrace technology
- Law Enforcement Agencies understaffed and under resourced
