(a) First time entrant (no previous tertiary enrolment):

- Applications close 30 June each year, for the following academic year. (For the 2022 intake the deadline has been extended to 31 July 2021.)
- Apply online at http://studies.nwu.ac.za/studies/apply
- The admission requirements based on grade 11 and 12 results will apply as stated above.
- Placements tests and selection apply.
- Applicants will be informed of a provisional admission decision by 30 September, the final decision on admission will be made and communicated after publication of official grade 12 results.

(b) Transfers from other faculties within the NWU:

- Applications close 30 September each year, for the following academic year.

- There are two options:
 - o If an applicant complies with the minimum admission requirements based on grade 12 results
 - he/she must pass all his/her prescribed modules in their current program up to the end of the year of application.

 - he/she must pass all their prescribed modules in their current programme with an average of at least 65% (in degree programmes with similar admission requirements) or
 - he/she must at least pass all their prescribed modules in their current programme with an average of at least 70% (in degree programmes with lower admission requirements or non-degree programmes).

- A decision regarding admission to the LLB will be taken after the end of the year examination results have been finalised.

(g) Continuation of studies after interruption of one academic year or more* (including financial exclusion)

- The Deputy Director Undergraduate Programs at the NWU campus applied for, has the discretion to allow or refuse re-admission, if an applicant did not pass all prescribed modules during their initial study period.

- Conditions (including progress requirements) for re-admission may be set.
- If admitted to a different programme or curriculum than the initial registration, a formal application for recognition of modules must be submitted by completing a student request form and submitting it to the applicable campus (see http://services.nwu.ac.za/studentacademic-lifecycle-administration/student-request-forms)
- Depending on the extent of the interruption and the time period when modules may have been completed, the Deputy Director, at his/her discretion, may require of a student to repeat certain modules even if they were completed / passed previously.

*No application for re-admission is required for an interruption of less than one academic year

(h) Re-admission after termination of studies due to unsatisfactory academic performance

- Applications close 30 June each year, for the following academic year. (For the 2022 intake the deadline has been extended to 31 July 2021.)

- The Deputy Director Undergraduate Programs at the NWU campus applied for, has the discretion to allow or refuse re-admission, if an applicant does submit convincing proof of a change in circumstances that led to the termination of studies.
- Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their applications by 30 November.
- If admitted to a different programme or curriculum than the initial registration, a formal application for recognition of modules must be submitted by completing a student request form and submitting it to the applicable campus (see http://services.nwu.ac.za/studentacademic-lifecycle-administration/student-request-forms)

In all instances above:

- Late applications will not be considered and applicants will be advised to re-apply the following year.
- Only complete applications will be considered. If any required information or documentation is outstanding, an application is incomplete.
- Enrolment planning and capacity will determine intake numbers.
- The decision to admit or refuse admission, set conditions or to recognise modules previously passed, will be taken by the Deputy Director Undergraduate Programmes, attached to the NWU campus applied for.
- A written appeal against such a decision by the Deputy Director, may be submitted to the Director Undergraduate Programmes, within 10 working days after the applicant was informed of the decision, at <u>LAW-PC@nwu.ac.za</u>
- The Deputy Director may, in his or her discretion, condone minor non-compliance with any of the requirements, based on written submissions by the applicant.
