

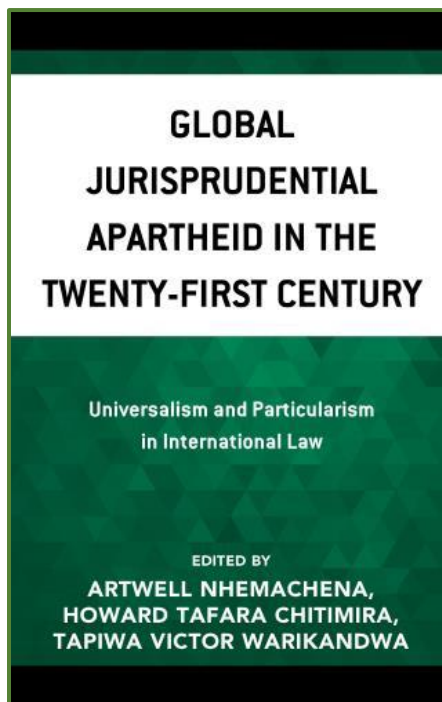

In particular, they analyse the ways in which these organizations hold and contribute to the increasing inequalities between the Global North and the Global South.
